



- 1 4. Guardianship matters except for compliance related hearings which include annual
- 2 accountings. Given the vulnerability of the guardianship populations, all protected persons
- 3 shall appear by alternative means;
- 4 5. Domestic temporary or extended protection orders;
- 5 6. Juvenile delinquency matters;
- 6 7. Abuse and neglect preliminary protective hearings;
- 7 8. High-risk protective orders;
- 8 9. Civil temporary restraining orders and preliminary/permanent injunctive relief hearings;
- 9 10. Probate petitions for orders of cremation;
- 10 11. Other than jury trials, case-by-case exceptions may be ordered at the discretion of a
- 11 District Court Judge.

12 All jury trials, civil and criminal, scheduled in District Court for the next 30 days will be  
13 suspended and will be rescheduled as the court calendar allows. No summonsed prospective jurors  
14 are to appear.

15 This order shall operate to stay trial in civil cases for purposes of NRCP 41(e). The time  
16 period of any continuance entered as a result of this order shall be excluded for purposes of  
17 calculating speedy trial under NRS 178.556(1) and NRS 174.511 as the Court finds that the ends  
18 of justice served by taking that action outweigh the interests of the parties and the public in a  
19 speedy trial. Absent further order of the Court or any individual judge, the period of exclusion  
20 shall be from March 16, 2020, to April 17, 2020. The Court may extend the period of exclusion  
21 as circumstances warrant.

22 Additionally, the Center for Disease Control has advised people to take precautions and  
23 that the best way to prevent illness is to avoid exposure. As a result, District Court Administration  
24

1 is ordered to post a notice at the entrance of all district court facilities advising the following  
2 people that they may not enter the court facility:

- 3 1. Persons who in the last 14 days have traveled to a country designated as a Level 3  
4 travel health notice according to the Centers of Disease Control and Prevention.  
5 Currently, those countries include China, Iran, South Korea, Austria, Belgium, Czech  
6 Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Iceland,  
7 Italy, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Netherlands, Norway,  
8 Poland, Portugal, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Monaco, San  
9 Marino, Vatican City, England, Scotland, Wales, Northern Ireland, and the Republic  
10 of Ireland. The list is subject to change by the CDC.
- 11 2. Persons who reside or have close contact with someone who has traveled to any  
12 foreign country listed above within the last 14 days.
- 13 3. Persons who have been asked to self-quarantine by any doctor, hospital, or health  
14 agency.
- 15 4. Persons who have been diagnosed with coronavirus or who has had contact in the past  
16 14 days with anyone who has been diagnosed with COVID-19.
- 17 5. Persons with unexplained fever, cough or shortness of breath.


18 Anyone attempting to enter in violation of these protocols will be denied entry by District  
19 Court Security.

21 call (775) 423 6088 extension 267 to speak with a Court Clerk for assistance in rescheduling their  
22 court appearance, arranging for an appearance by alternative means or provide other information  
23 based on the circumstances of the appearance.
